University of St. Andrews Exchange/Direct Enroll

William & Mary has a two-prong relationship with St. Andrews: Exchange and Direct Enroll. The tuition exchange agreement between the College of William & Mary and the University of St. Andrews allows W&M students to pay their regular tuition to W&M while taking classes at St. Andrews. The exchange program is best for VA in-state students. Students not chosen for the exchange program have the option of direct enrolling.

Founded in 1411, St. Andrews is one of the most selective universities in Great Britain and is situated in the picturesque city of St. Andrews on Scotland's East Coast.

The total population of St. Andrews (students and staff) is 7600. St. Andrews is not a campus university. The campus lies in the heart of the town, mingling with shops, pubs, offices and houses. Green fields, distant hills, and the sea are seldom out of view.

Students and professors share the collegiate life of a medieval university, enjoying its ancient traditions such as the chapel where John Knox preached and the ruins of the earliest Christian settlements.
