Process for Revising the W&M Faculty Handbook Committee on Academic Affairs

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What is the W&M Faculty Handbook?

- 1. Statement of rights and responsibilities of all members of the W&M community (Sec. I)
- 2. Definition of roles and delegations consistent with Board Bylaws (all sections)
- 3. Foundation for shared governance: organization (Sec. II) and faculty-specific policies (Sec. III)
- 4. Knowledge repository (all sections)

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What Authorities Govern the Handbook?

The Board of Visitors (BOV) is the ultimate institutional authority under the *Code of Virginia*. Per the *Faculty Handbook*, p. 8, "Nothing in this document shall affect the powers of the Board of Visitors as provided by law."

Per the **BOV Bylaws**, the BOV approves major policy and organization changes per the **president's** recommendation – or delegates such authority to the president.

As approved by the BOV, the *Faculty Handbook* specifies roles, delegations, and processes related to academic matters – including the formal advisory role of **Faculty Assembly** and the **Personnel Policy Committee** with respect to amendments.

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Why Revise?

- 1. The legal landscape has changed significantly since 2008
- 2. Multiple academic entities are considering reorganization and should have due recognition in their new forms: A&S, CDAS, etc.
- 3. Governance reviews are expected for accreditation on a 10-year cycle (due 2026)

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Principles for Revision

- 1. Assume positive intent
- 2. Respect the time of all involved
- 3. Work in a transparent way
 - Set clear deadlines and deliverables
 - Give due regard to established roles and authorities
 - Consult multiple perspectives and constituencies
 - Show and tell process

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Faculty Handbook Committee

President's Charge to the Committee: lead a transparent process for updating the *Faculty Handbook*, consistent with the Board's September 2023 charge. Identify goals for revision from key constituencies, establish and publish a scope of work, then seek approval for changes and craft language per those approvals. Complete work by Fall 2024.

Scope of Work

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To be established by the committee in December 2023, after an open call for suggestions and incorporating the Board's charge. The committee's initial scope of work will be published in January 2024.

Preliminary Approvals

Any process approvals that reviewing parties may require for the committee to work in an expeditious and transparent way.

E.g.: "In this revision process, changes to Section II and III will follow a common approval sequence: PPC \rightarrow FA as specified in the current Handbook, then FA \rightarrow Provost \rightarrow President \rightarrow Board for Sections II and III."

Spring 2024

Voting Phase

The committee will post its Scope of Work, noting progress in regular updates. The committee will post concepts for changes at minimum four weeks in advance of votes by PPC and FA, to make them available for comment before those votes. The committee will then seek approval for the changes as follows: votes by PPC → votes by FA.

The Provost will monitor progress and update the BOV in the Committee on Academic Affairs at regular intervals.

Final Approvals

Fall 2024

The Committee will seek final approvals for the full document, which will be posted in advance of voting by:

PPC FA

Provost

President

Board

NOTE: University Counsel has final approval of all language with respect to matters of law.

Implementation

Spring 2025

A "Parking Lot" of implementation tasks will be established during revisions, to be implemented by Spring 2025 at the latest.

The new Handbook will take effect on a specified date in 2025.
