#### Overview

In 2023-2024, the EPC approved 226 proposals: 6 policy actions, 32 curriculum changes, 87 COLL attributes, 37 new courses, and 63 course changes. There was a change in procedure this year as CLA took on an expanded role in assessing COLL proposals. Along with the existing COLL 100/150 subcommittee, CLA is now tasked with reviewing all COLL applications to be better prepared to advise faculty.

The committee continued a discussion from Spring 2023 about a proposal to allow students who participated in the VERTO pathway program to receive COLL 300 credit for the semester abroad upon transferring to W&M. A pilot was conducted for the academic year through which students would submit reflection essays to the Office of Undergraduate Academic Affairs for assessment. The pilot was deemed a success with 27 of 37 eligible students completing essays, with 19 approved for COLL 300 credit. [Appendix 1]

In October, the committee discussed the findings of the COLL 150 assessment conducted the previous year. Concerns were raised whether COLL 150 adequately prepares students for upper-level courses in terms of writing skills. EPC members discussed the variation in writing assignments and the need for shared expectations. Action items included: consolidation of COLL discussion and elaboration language on web pages to a single page, modification of the C150 Curriculog form to ask how courses meet the 24pp/6000-word requirement, development of a checklist/toolkit for C150s to ensure they continue to meet their original goals even if instructors change or courses are in place for long periods of time.

The Dean's Office requested EPC input regarding the threshold levels for the Dean's List. Currently 50% of students reach the threshold of 3.6 Grade Point Average. The committee requested data to understand various options, such as changing from a GPA to a percentile cut-off, the creation of a two-tiered Dean's List, and what these changes may look like demographically. These discussions will continue in Fall 2024. [Appendix 2]

EPC also had fruitful conversations with representatives from VIMS regarding the creation of a BS degree in Marine Science.

### **Policy Actions**

- UCGS and Passport transfer credits: Allows students who take REL 238 through the VCCS to receive ALV knowledge domain credit. (approved by EPC: 12/11/2023)
- Permission for students participating in W&M's Winter Break programs be permitted to overload up to 5 additional credits on their fall registration without permission from the Committee on Academic Status. (approved by EPC: 2/13/2024)
- Prerequisites and Failing Grades: Students who receive a failing grade in a prerequisite course for a pre-registered course will be dropped from the pre-registered course by the Registrar's office. (approved by EPC: 2/13/2024)
- C100/C150 capacity changes: Three-year pilot that increases C100 to 26 seats and C150 to 16seats. (approved by EPC: 11/13/2023)
- C100/150 Restrictions: Restricts students from taking more than one COLL 100 or 150 or taking both in the same semester. (approved by EPC: 2/13/2024)
- NROTC: Cross-registration agreement, which would allow W&M students to participate in a Naval ROTC program through Hampton University. (approved by EPC: 6/18/2024)

### **Appendices**

#### Appendix 1: COLL 300 credit for VERTO pathway transfers

#### **Verto C300 Pilot: Reflection Essay**

This proposed pilot allows students who participated in the Verto Program in fall 2023 to meet their COLL 300 requirement through a reflection essay. This process parallels the option for continuing students who meet the requirements through a third-party study abroad program.

Currently, there are approximately 35 students admitted and attending a Verto program. This pilot would not apply to students who participated in Verto prior to fall 2023.

#### **Reflection Essay Process:**

All incoming undergraduates must enroll in and complete College Studies, an online pre-matriculation Blackboard course designed to orient students to the university's policies and processes. The Office of Undergraduate Academic Affairs (OUAA) oversees College Studies. For this pilot, incoming Verto students will have the option to submit an essay reflecting on their study abroad academic experience as part of the College Studies course. Staff in the OUAA and the A&S Dean's Office will review the essays to determine eligibility for awarding COLL 300 credit.

- Students will submit reflections through College Studies as an assignment by February 2<sub>nd</sub> (the end of the spring add/drop period).
- Students will respond to the following prompt: "Using specific examples, reflect on how your academic experience abroad deepened your engagement with the culture in which you studied, and ways that you see similarities or differences with your own lived experiences prior to study abroad." (800-1000 words) This is a modified version of the current prompt EPC approved for W&M Study Abroad COLL 300 reflection essays. We removed the phrase "and/or connections to your previous academic experiences" as those experiences would refer to high school.
- o We will clearly define "academic experiences" to include coursework, academic setting, teaching methods, interactions with faculty and classmates, course excursions and other experiences outside the classroom which relate to students' academic studies and the goals of COLL300.
- For this pilot, the Assistant Dean for Undergraduate Education, Arts & Sciences and the Director of Undergraduate Academic Affairs will evaluate the essays using the rubric below. Students must receive a combined score of 14 (out of 18) or higher.
- Upon successful completion, the University Registrar's office will apply the COLL 300 designation to the Verto transfer courses and the OUAA will notify the student. If a student does not earn the minimum score, they will have the opportunity to resubmit one additional attempt within 10 business days of notification.
- The EPC-approved process for third-party program approval mandates that the ISAC performs an annual review of the COLL 300 essay evaluation. At the end of this pilot program, the OUAA will report the outcomes to EPC for oversight and evaluation, as well as a decision on the viability of the program moving forward in an on-going fashion.

### **Appendix 2: Dean's List Criteria**

#### **RATIONALE:**

In working with the new A&S comms director on publicizing the Dean's List, I realized that in any given semester roughly 50% of the undergraduate students qualify for this honor. I then shared the following information with the dean and, at her request, am forwarding this to EPC for review.

### **CURRENT POLICY:**

The Dean's List refers to those full-time degree-seeking undergraduate students who have completed at least 12 (standard letter graded, not including "P" or "G") credit hours and earned a 3.6 Grade Point Average in one semester. Courses taken on a pass/fail or audit basis do not count in the minimum 12 credit hours. This recognition is noted on the student's academic transcript.
