

Gender, Sexuality, & Women's Studies Minor

All students must complete at least **18 credit hours** distributed across five groups of courses as follows:

- 1. Two core courses. Take 6 credits including:
 - GSWS 205, "Introduction to Gender, Sexuality, and Women's Studies" (3 credits)
 - GSWS 405, "Feminist Theory" (3 credits)
- 2. Gender and International Issues (GIN): One course with a focus on gender and international issues (outside of US/Canada/Great Britain): GSWS 291/391/491 or a course with a GIN attribute (3 or 4 credits)
- 3. Sexualities and Transgender Studies (LGBT): One course with a focus on LGBTQ issues: GSWS 292/392/492 or a course with LGBT attribute (3 or 4 credits)
- 4. Gender, Race, and Ethnicity (GRE): One course with a focus on gender and race/ethnicity issues: GSWS 293/393/493 or a course with GRE attribute (3 or 4 credits)
- 5. Approved electives, if necessary

PLEASE NOTE

- All courses must be selected in consultation with a Gender, Sexuality, & Women's Studies
 advisor. All courses taken outside Gender, Sexuality, & Women's Studies and used to fulfill
 credits towards the major must be approved by the Curriculum Committee.
- If you take a course that is cross-listed with Gender, Sexuality, & Women's Studies but you register for it in the other department, you may count that course towards your Gender, Sexuality, & Women's Studies major without getting approval from the Curriculum Committee.
- No more than ten credits of introductory courses (excluding GSWS 205) and six credits of Independent Study may count toward the major.
- Some courses will have multiple attributes (for instance, both GIN and LGBT), but you may NOT double-count a single course to fulfill multiple attribute requirements.

Below are examples of past courses that could fulfill each of the domain requirements. This list is not exhaustive and only includes courses that have been taught multiple times from 2022 - current.
