

W&M D.C. Semester Program Costs to Students

The cost for scholars to attend the D.C. Semester Program is:

- A non-refundable \$750 program fee
- Standard semester tuition and fees ([please check here for current rates](#))

Tuition is charged to the student's account and is payable either via check or online via eServices.

If you choose to live in D.C. housing provided by the W&M Washington Center during the D.C. Semester Program, there is the additional non-refundable cost of \$6,000 for a double room.

Day to Day Costs in D.C.

The average cost per student will vary; however, most students report spending roughly \$125-200 per week on "groceries and other necessities".

What Your Tuition and Fees Will Cover

- Staff support while you secure a guaranteed internship and while you intern throughout the semester
- Regular meetings with staff for personalized career advice, guidance on resumes, cover letters, and applications
- Subsidized social/cultural events throughout the summer
- A local alumni mentor and introductory dinner event

Financial Aid

Students currently receiving financial aid can likely increase their aid to match the costs of the program. All students should work with their financial aid counselors for more specific information.
