Please describe your payment plans, if provided:

If a member wishes, they may pay their dues in three different segments throughout the semester, as opposed to once at the beginning of the semester. The application is sent out prior to dues being distributed and asks the member to elaborate on their circumstances and why it would be beneficial for them to pay in three installments, which VP of Finance and the District Director approve. There is no maximum limit for members on payment plans, as long as they have a reason. The dues are due on the 20th of each month from when the dues are billed, until the three installments are paid.

Please describe scholarship options for new and current members, if provided:

The Kappa Foundation has 150+ scholarships and offers three types: graduate, undergraduate merit-based and undergraduate need-based.



Applicants may only apply for one scholarship per academic year. Scholarships are awarded for the next academic year. Scholarship funds may only be used for educational purposes, such as tuition payments, cost of books, and lab fees. Scholarships may not be used to pay for debt already incurred or to pay chapter dues or fees.

There are scholarships from the KKG Foundation specifically for language study abroad programs, STEM, music, risk management, journalism as well as for our BIPOC members. You do not need to apply for a specific scholarship, but you do need to include your field of study and activities in your application so that we may note your eligibility for specific scholarships. If you wish to be considered for our BIPOC scholarships, you must complete the optional question on race identification on the application. Applicants are automatically considered for any scholarships for which they qualify.

Sorority residency requirements:

All 19 spots must be filled. Spots are filled on a volunteer basis in the following order - Senior Chapter Officers, Seniors, Junior Chapter Officers, Juniors, Sophomore Chapter Officers, Sophomores. If any spots remain open after volunteers are requested, members will be pulled in the reverse order (sophomores—> senior officers) until the house is full.

All Sorority Housing is owned and operated by the University Housing Office. Items included in the perterm range amounts are room, deposit, wireless internet, air conditioning, etc. Campus housing costs, as set by the University Housing of ice, are as follows: Single: \$5,015.00, Double: \$4,648.00

What fees may a member encounter that are separate from dues billed by your chapter:

Apparel is an optional cost for members. The average member may spend up to \$150.00 on apparel per year- however, it is not required. There is also an expense when taking a little for their Clue Week, which can be on the lesser side if you provide free activities and pass down items but can also cost up to \$300. Additionally, if you miss the billing period (20 days), you may be required to pay a late fee, which typically averages out to around \$10.00.
