Chi Omega provides an optional installment plan for members who wish to break up their payments throughout the semester. They may pay their dues in two different segments throughout the semester instead of all at once in the beginning.

Please describe scholarship options for new members, if provided:

For new members, Chi Omega offers an internal scholarship to assist in paying for chapter dues. Recipients are selected by the chapter Treasurer based on an application process. Need-based assistance is also considered. Degree of assistance is dependent on the number of people who apply. Also, tuition-based scholarships are available from Chi Omega nationals, ranging from \$1000 to \$4000, and both new and current members are able to apply.

What fees may a PNM encounter that are separate from dues and fees billed by your chapter?

(ex: big-little clue week costs, apparel or merchandise, cost to participate in outside events, FINES - if events are missed or late on dues payments, etc.)

Chi Omega members typically spend around \$75 on big-little baskets. While apparel is optional, many members choose to buy apparel costing around \$60-\$80 per semester. If you miss a mandatory event, it may result in fines, from \$5-\$50, depending on the magnitude of the event. If you are late on your due payments, fines will be issued through the chapter billing service (3.5% late fee with a minimum charge of \$1.00)..

Delta Delta Delta provides two opportunities to help members who need financial support:

1. Extraordinary Membership Status (EMS)
 - a. An initiated member may apply for EMS if they have an extraordinary circumstance preventing them from participating in any chapter activities. EMS is an option for reduced dues. New members can apply for EMS at the beginning of their second semester. This is granted to up to 2 members and must be applied for.
2. Payment Plans
 - b. If a member wishes, they can be on a payment plan, paying their dues at three separate time throughout the semester, instead of all at once.

Please describe scholarship options for new members, if provided:

Delta Delta Delta Nationals provides scholarships that can be applied for by March 1 for the upcoming year.

What fees may a PNM encounter that are separate from dues and fees billed by your chapter?

Delta Delta Delta members typically spend around \$100 dollars for big-little clue week. Additionally, there is a reverse clue week for seniors (pansy week) at the end of the semester. Apparel for non-required events is not paid for by Tri Delta. While the extra apparel is optional, members who choose to purchase it usually spend around \$60 throughout the semester. If a member misses their dues payment, they may be subject to fines. The fine for a late payment is issued 2% per billing cycle, which is 30 days.

Members are able to choose from 3 different payment plans: monthly, semesterly, or pay in full. With all three payment plans, for the first statement, members are expected to pay their bill on the first of the month. The Fraternity-approved accounting system will issue bills to members/new members prior to the first day of every month. Afterwards, depending on the payment plan that members select, you will receive an invoice every month that will either have a charge (monthly plan) or no charge (semesterly/pay in full).

National Delta Gamma has multiple merit-based scholarships as well as need-based scholarships available on its website.

What fees may a PNM encounter that are separate from dues and fees billed by your chapter?

Members typically spend around \$100 dollars on big-little clue week as a big. While apparel is optional, most members buy apparel amounting up to \$30 per semester. If you miss an event, you are not required to pay a fine, but if your dues payment is late, you will be issued a \$5 fine for every week or part of a week in which the bill remains unpaid.

Chapter members typically spend some money during their time as a big during big-little clue week, which would typically be in the fall the year after the member joined the chapter (can vary based on COBs and when/if a member decides to take a little). There is no expected amount to be spent, but around \$100 or less would be a reasonable estimate. Apparel is another optional cost that members may incur, and apparel is available typically once per semester. Prices for apparel items typically range from \$15-50, and there are usually 3 different apparel items available for purchase. Members also must pay additional fees for philanthropy shirts in the spring semester (typically about \$15) and shirts for recruitment in the fall (partially subsidized, but each shirt may be up to \$15). Members can choose to participate in some additional

sisterhood events that are partially subsidized and may have to pay out of pocket if they choose to attend events that are not fully subsidized. Scholarships may not be used to pay for debt already incurred or to pay chapter dues or fees. Do NOT include that you need the scholarship to pay your chapter dues in your essay. We cannot award you a scholarship for your chapter dues – no exceptions.

There are scholarships specifically for language study abroad programs, STEM, music, risk management, journalism as well as for our BIPOC members. All 14 spots must be filled.

All new members sign a contract before initiation agreeing to live in the chapter house if selected and if they have not already signed a lease. Eligible members are then selected by lottery to live in the chapter house if demand exceeds the number of rooms. If there are not enough members to fill the chapter house, the Finance Team pulls a member to fill the empty space in the house.

All Sorority Housing is owned and operated by the University Housing Office. Items included in the per-term range amounts are: Room, deposit, wireless internet, air conditioning.

Please describe your payment plans, if provided:

Pi Beta Phi HQ offers a three-payment plan each semester for any member who wishes to pay their dues in installments. There is no financial requirement or pre-approval process for obtaining a payment plan. Members on payment plans pay one-third of their dues on September 20, one-third on October 20, and the remaining third on November 20 (using fall semester as an example). Payments must be made on or before their due date. Otherwise, the plan is voided, and the full amount must be paid in full as soon as possible. Our chapter's Vice President of Finance and Housing is happy to talk about alternative payment plans for members with extenuating financial circumstances.

Please describe scholarship options for new members, if provided:

Our chapter encourages members and PNMs to explore all opportunities for scholarships. Pi Beta Phi HQ has created over 100 scholarships for undergraduate members to apply for that open November 15 each year. HQ also has a grant program members can apply for in times of unexpected financial hardship. Our chapter's Director of Academics also regularly announces and promotes scholarship opportunities from Pi Beta Phi HQ, the state of Virginia, and other organizations Pi Phi supports.

What fees may a PNM encounter that are separate from dues and fees billed by your chapter?

(ex: big-little clue week costs, apparel or merchandise, cost to participate in outside events, FINES - if events are missed or late on dues payments, etc.)

The Virginia Gamma of Pi Beta Phi has implemented a "points system" to replace the previous system of fines we used to increase the financial accessibility of our chapter. As a result, no member will ever be issued a fine for missed mandatory events or other circumstances. None of our chapter-sponsored events will have an additional fee. Costs members may incur outside of the dues they pay include the optional purchase of t-shirts or apparel (the average member may spend \$50), or the optional purchases associated with Clue Week for members taking littles (the average member may spend \$25-\$50). Purchases for apparel and Clue Week are entirely optional and never required. Any apparel that is required is paid for by Pi Beta Phi, not members. Finally, our chapter collects apparel from past years so that members taking littles need not spend money on gifts for their littles.
