To fund a festival honoring the past, present, and future Black members of the William & Mary Community

The Sankofa Legacy Fest Act

An Act of the 329th Student Assembly of William & Mary,

Sponsored by Senator Shaunna Scott ('23)

Supported by Chair of the Senate Owen Williams ('23)

WHEREAS, the 'Sankofa Seed' sculpture is an art installation created by Steve Prince, who is a distinguished artist in residence at the Muscarelle Museum of Art at William & Mary;

WHEREAS, the sculpture features a Sankofa bird, symbolizing looking at the past in order to move forward;

WHEREAS, both the Legacy Tribute Garden and the sculpture are meant to honor past, present, and future Black members of the William & Mary community;

WHEREAS, a ceremony to celebrate the sculpture and bring continuous awareness to the Black members of the William & Mary community would create an important ongoing legacy;

WHEREAS, having this celebration would show the evolution of William & Mary regarding Black culture and the progression to come;

WHEREAS, this event will occur around the Sunken Garden, the Wren Building, and the Legacy Garden;

WHEREAS, this event will showcase the arts from the African Diaspora including live performances, poetry, dance, history, and visual arts;

WHEREAS, these showcases will include both student and professional performances;

WHEREAS, there will be multiple African American inspired vendors for both food and crafts (around 3-4 for cuisine, and 5 for clothings and crafts);

WHEREAS, there will be a T-shirt and posters booth to raise proceeds for future Legacy Festivals;

WHEREAS, this 3-hour event will occur in the Fall Semester and will convene at sunset; WHEREAS, funding this celebration would show our support towards progression, acknowledging,

and learning from William & Mary's egregious history towards Black communities.

Now, therefore, be it,

RESOLVED, that the Student Assembly of William & Mary:

- 1. Allocates \$7,010 from the Student Assembly Reserves for the celebration to fund the following:
 - a. The Day Program African Drummers, Hampton, Virginia (\$2,000)
 - b. No B.S. Brass Band, Richmond, Virginia (\$5,000)
 - c. Flyers (\$10).
- 2. Encourages the Student Assembly to contribute funding for the event annually.
- 3. Ensures that the event is properly publicized by being listed in the Student Happenings, newsletters, etc.
- 4. Stipulates that any unused funds be returned to the Student Assembly Reserves.
