*To ensure security, accountability, and accessibility of Registered Student Organizations' Assets*

**The RSO Swipe Act**

An Act of the 330<sup>th</sup> Student Assembly of William & Mary,

Sponsored by Sen. Eugene Lee (23'), Sen. Matthew Hwang ('25)

WHEREAS, following the expansion of Sadler Center West, many Campus Center resources relocated from the Campus Center to the newly constructed spaces in the expansion;

WHEREAS, while many of these resources relocated, one of these resources – closet spaces for registered student organizations (RSOs) where RSO supplies and materials were stored safely and securely – was not;

WHEREAS, in order to access one of these closets, it was required to provide a student ID card to the front desk, where the attendant would exchange this ID for a key to the closet and return the ID to the student once the key had been returned to the attendant, providing security and accountability for RSOs;

WHEREAS, with the new closet space at Campus Center, the operational supplies and materials of certain RSOs are stored in a closet that is secured with a keypad, with codes being provided to select RSO members;

WHEREAS, the code for the RSO closet keypad will not be changed regularly and does not provide data on who has accessed the closet;

WHEREAS, the current system does not adequately secure the thousands of dollars of assets that Student Assembly has funded for these RSOs nor provide flexibility in access for both the RSOs and the Student Leadership Development (SLD) staff, as codes for the keypad can easily be passed along to any person while a swipe card reader can easily be updated and managed;

WHEREAS, no other funding source would provide funding to address this lack of security and accountability of these important assets;

WHEREAS, as the primary funding source of student organizations on campus, it is the responsibility of the Student Assembly to address this security issue in order to protect these assets; and

WHEREAS, Student Leadership Development will ensure that the affected RSOs are notified of the new security change to their closet space following the passage of the bill.

Now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Student Assembly of William & Mary,

1. Allocates \$5,000 from the Student Assembly reserves to fund a card swipe reader for the RSO closet at Campus Center.
  - a. Costs include the card reader, installation of the reader, and labor fees (via William & Mary facilities management).
2. Stipulates that all unused funds will return to the Student Assembly Reserves.
