A Bill

To facilitate voter awareness in the Williamsburg community

The Let's Vote Act

An Act of the 331st Student Assembly of William & Mary,

Sponsored by Senator Spencer Krivo ('26), Senator Hazel Vineet ('25), Senator Matt Swenson ('26)

Supported by Secretary of Public Affairs Grayson Horner ('26)

WHEREAS, voting is a critical civic duty for an individual living in a democratic society;

WHEREAS, the student body of William & Mary make up a significant portion of voters in Williamsburg;

WHEREAS, Student Assembly desires to increase student turnout in the fall 2024 elections, because voting is a critical part of student voice in the Williamsburg community, and can yield benefits for the rights and interests of students;

WHEREAS, the 2024 election cycle has particularly consequential implications for the Williamsburg community;

WHEREAS, several student organizations participate in voter engagement efforts;

WHEREAS, Student Assembly endeavors to be and is required to be non-partisan in all its efforts, and increased student voting regardless of partisanship is beneficial;

WHEREAS, Student Assembly has a stated purpose in getting students involved with local government;

Now, therefore, be it,

RESOLVED, that the Student Assembly of William & Mary,

- 1. Allocates up to \$580 from the Student Assembly Reserves for the purchasing of
 - a. \$80 for 200 full page colored fliers
 - b. \$196 for 1000 4x9 Palm Cards from the Print Shop
 - c. \$300 for 250 3x3 inch stickers
- 2. Charges the sponsors of the bill to table and help distribute posters and materials
- 3. Charges the Student Assembly Department of Outreach and Class Senators to advertise the initiative through social media
- 4. Stipulates that all unused funds be returned to the Student Assembly Reserves.

- 5. Designates language that is approved to be used during voter registration and outreach efforts, and language that is prohibited to be used during voter registration efforts.
- 6. Approved Language includes:
 - a. Language mentioning election information (when, where, and how to vote).
 - b. Language mentioning the variety of elections on the ballot.
 - c. Language broadly referencing students need to leverage our voices and be heard in the city.
 - d. Language simply stating the candidates on the ballot.
- 7. Prohibited Language includes:
 - a. Language discussing or promoting any particular candidate for office or their particular policy positions, even in a non-biased manner.
 - b. Language discussing or promoting the importance of electing a Student to Williamsburg City Council, even without mentioning a particular candidate.
