A Bill

To Reaffirm Student Assemblies Commitment to Graduate Student Engagement

The Going to the Grads Act of 332nd Student Assembly

An Act of the 332nd Student Assembly of William & Mary,

Sponsored by Senator Connor M. O'Neill (Law), Senator S. Connor Cheadle (Law)

Co-sponsored by Senator Morgan J. Brittain (Graduate A&S), Senator Vedant Singh (Business), Senator Seyda Celci (Business)

Supported by Class President Zoe Wang ('26)

WHEREAS, William & Mary has five graduate institutions that routinely send representatives to the Student Assembly, including the Virginia Institute of Marine Science (VIMS), Arts & Sciences, School of Business, School of Education, and Law School;

WHEREAS, these graduate schools have, collectively, more than 2700 students, all of whom are represented under the umbrella of Student Assembly, who make up approximately twenty-eight percent of our student population, most of whom pay the student activity fees the Student Assembly is entrusted to steward;

WHEREAS, the Student Assembly is tasked with being the premier representative body of the student body of William & Mary, including graduate and professional students;

WHEREAS, the physical presence of a governing body can have an impact on the perceived connection of that body to its constituents;

WHEREAS, Student Assembly has little connection to graduate schools' individual governance organizations aside from their representatives to Senate;

WHEREAS, it can be difficult for graduate students who are not their school's designated representative to participate and advocate in the Student Assembly of William & Mary due to the spatial separation between main campus and many of the individual graduate and professional schools;

WHEREAS, Student Assembly leaders have undertaken efforts to better include graduate students in student life, student activities fee administration, and student governance at William & Mary, and this bill represents only one such effort;

Now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Student Assembly of William & Mary:

- 1. Charges the Chair of the Student Assembly Senate and Graduate Senators with scheduling a Senate meeting at each graduate school that sends a representative to Student Assembly during each of the sessions when that school is represented:
 - a. The Chair shall be responsible for:
 - i. Scheduling which school will host when, using relevant criteria and providing notification to that school's representative at least a month in advance.
 - ii. Organizing transportation, as needed, for senators to travel to these meetings.
 - b. Graduate senators shall be responsible for:
 - i. Preparing to host the Senate by reserving an appropriate room.
 - ii. Inviting the student and administrative leadership of their school to deliver remarks during the meeting at their school.
 - iii. Informing appropriate persons of the location of the meeting at their school at least two weeks in advance.
 - iv. Arranging other appropriate activities, such as tours, to take place during the visit to their school, as possible within the time parameters.
- 2. Allocates up to \$300 from the Student Assembly Reserves for the potential provisioning of light refreshments, and or securing of accommodations.
- 3. Stipulates that all unused funds will be returned to the Student Assembly Reserves.
- 4. Charges the Department of Outreach with providing the student body with the schedule and locations of Student Assembly meetings for these special meetings as early as possible.
- 5. Charges the bill's sponsors with pursuing additional efforts to aid graduate student representation and inclusion at William & Mary.
